SUMMARY

- Wyoming has emerged as a serious premiership threat following a convincing 4-2 win over Berkeley Vale in Round 9 of the CountryNet Premier League football competition at Killarney Vale Athletics Field. In its best performance of the season Wyoming dominated for most of the match against a Berkeley Vale side weakened by the absence of leading players David Graham and Pat Dalton. Goals to Nathan Moseley and Jack North gave the Tigers a 2-0 half-time lead. Berkeley Vale bounced back with a 70th-minute goal to Jason Griffiths before strikes to Michael Payne and a second to North sealed the match for the Wyoming. The loss sees Berkeley Vale drop to third place, although they have played eight matches compared to the nine of the top two. Wyoming, who have played seven matches, remain in fourth place.
- Umina has retained its spot at the top of the table despite being held to 1-1 draw by competition surprise packets Killarney District in their match at Umina Oval. The home team took the lead in the 55th minute through Jason Stafford before Killarney equalised 15 minutes from the end through a Tim Knight penalty. The result means that Umina remain unbeaten after nine matches while it was Killarney's fifth in a row without defeat.
- A second half hat-trick to Blake Jesson was the highlight of another big win to East Gosford who defeated Wyong 6-2 in their match at Baker Park. The home team fought hard throughout the first half, holding their more fancied rivals to a 1-1 scoreline at the break, but collapsed under a second-half onslaught from the Rams who scored five goals in one half for the second time in three matches, and have now scored 15 goals in their past three. Glenn Watkins (2) and Adam McGuire were East Gosford's other goal scorers with the win taking the team up to second spot just one point behind leaders Umina.
- Budgewoi's season has begun to pick up some momentum with their second win in three matches, downing Kanwal 1-0 at Wadalba Sports Complex. Ben Runge scored the only goal just before half-time. The result lifts Budgewoi out of the relegation zone for the first time this season while Kanwal's ongoing goal drought sees them drop to eighth place.
- The final match, between Kincumber and The Entrance, was postponed when Frost Reserve was closed due to overnight rain and will be re-scheduled for a midweek date, probably in early July.

- In other Premier League news, the teams for the annual North vs South representative match to be played at Plum Park on Monday 13 June have been announced. The match, kicking off at 2pm, will be played as a curtain-raiser to the 4pm clash between Central Coast FC and the Mariners. All proceeds from the two games will go to the Cancer Council's Call To Arms Campaign. Gates open at 1pm, entry for adults will be \$10, students and concession holders \$5, and children under 16 free. The North and South teams are:
