# Champions Wyoming cap faultless season

WYOMING completed a near perfect season by becoming the first Central Coast first grade side to ever win a Champion of Champions title on Sunday.

The win in the premier division capped an outstanding day for coast clubs with East Gosford's under-15 boys and Kincumber's under-12 girls team also winning their divisions.

Wyoming scored 66 goals and conceded only 19. Key players Marc Falzon, Trevor Shute (injured) and Aaron Hood (suspension) all missed the final.
