Welcome to Barry Cartner to the team as Manager. Thanks Barry your efforts are appreciated by myself and the team.

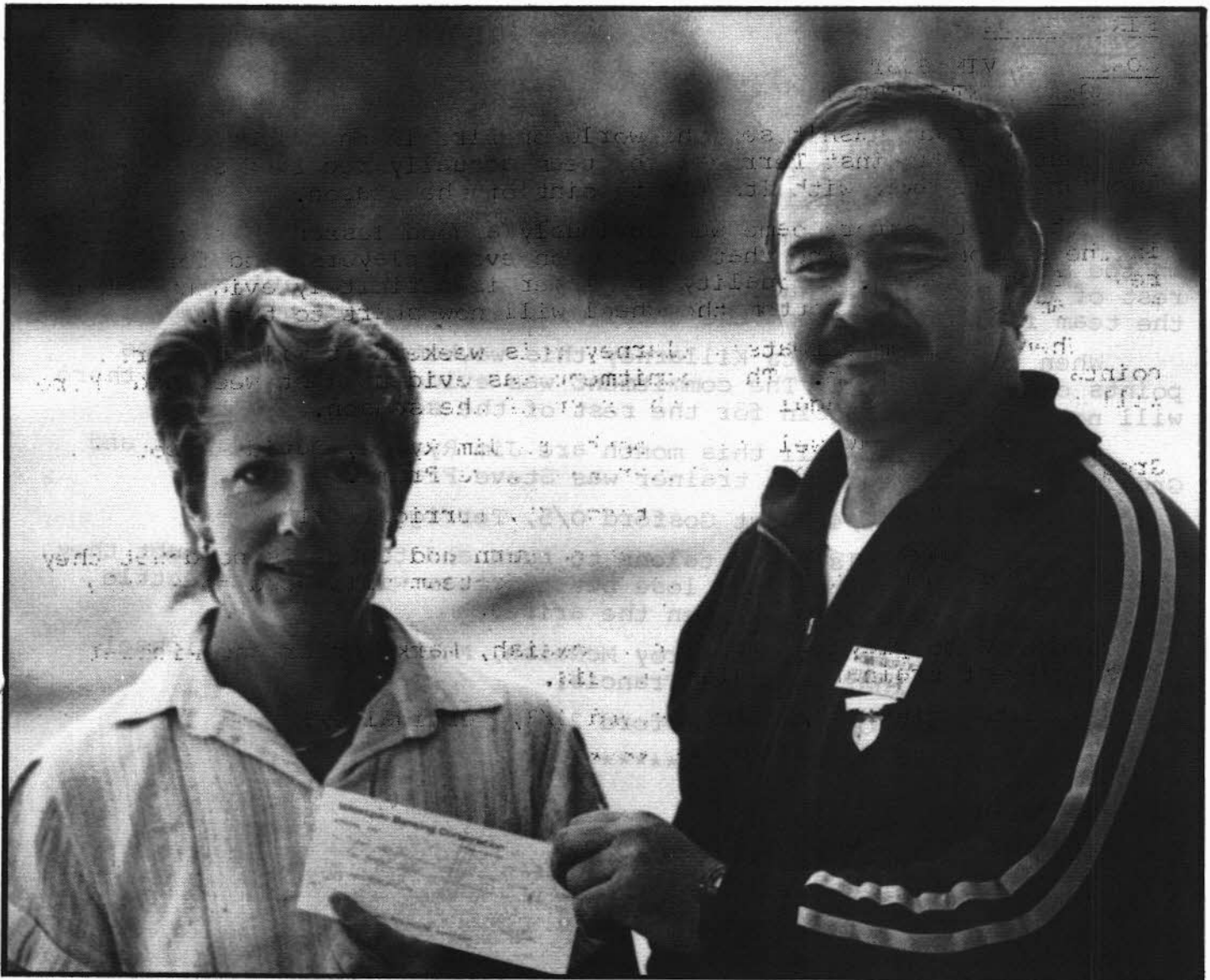

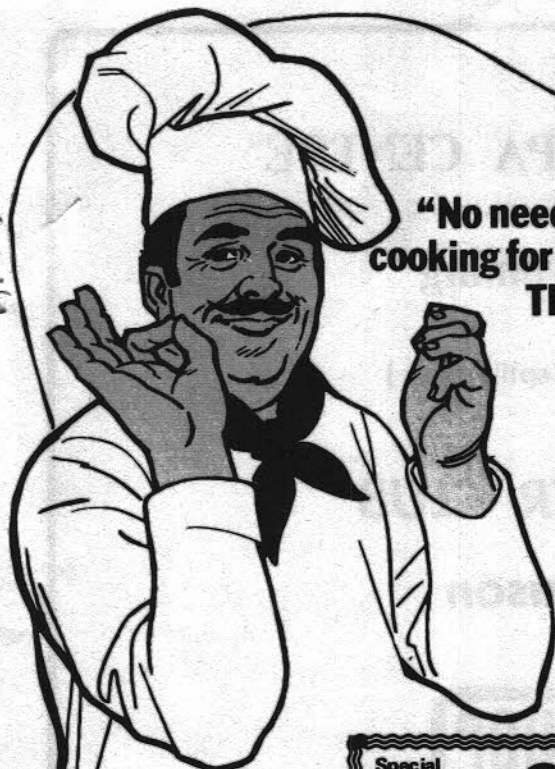
We haven't won a game but we haven't lost and we must continue to improve because we can play better and when that happens we can get both points.


