

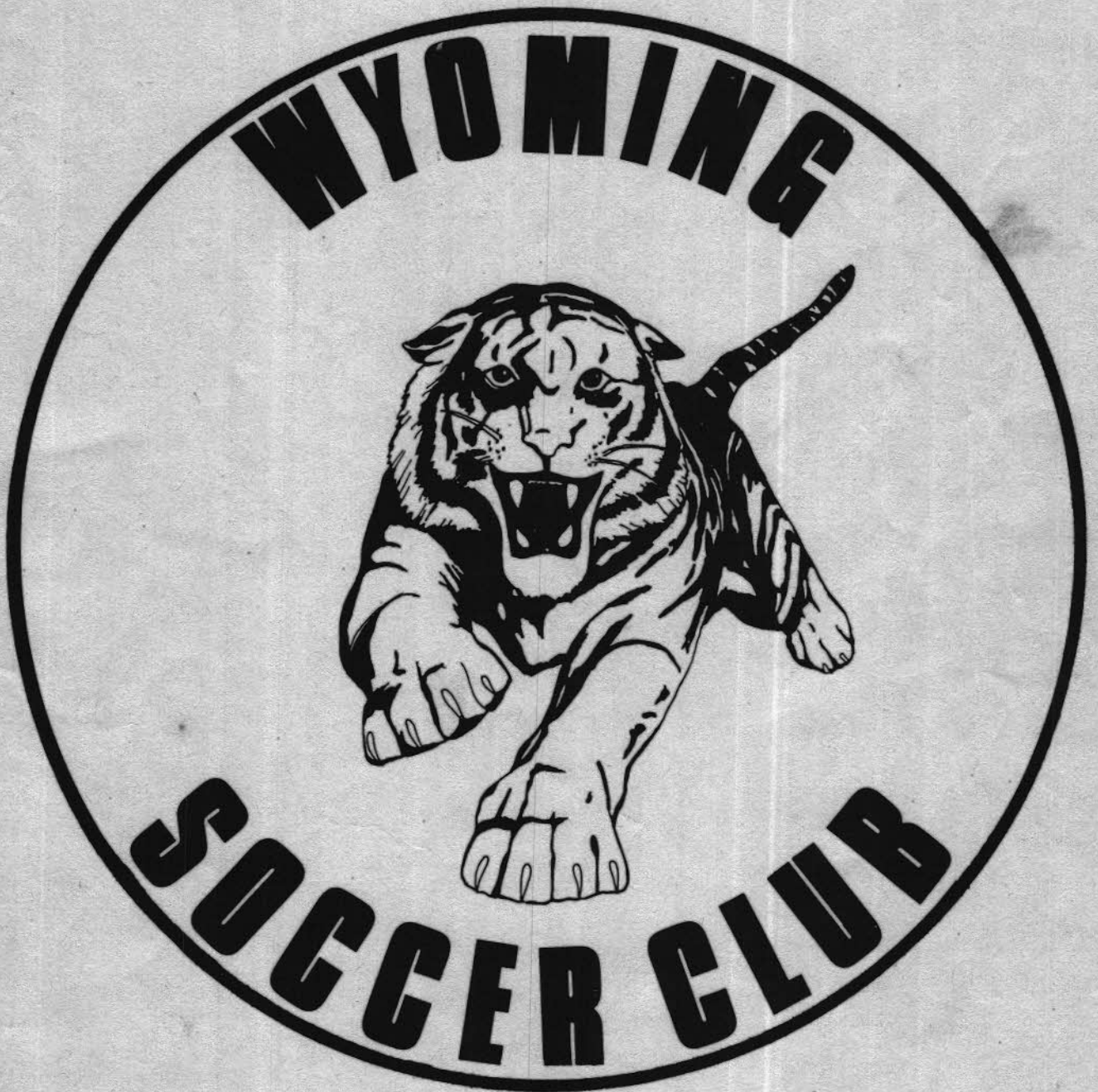

I'd like to thank you for your support and encouragement upon my making the National Youth Squad. My trip to America was very beneficial towards both my knowledge of soccer and of the American way of life.

While in America, we took part in the Dallas Cup, which is in its 8th year. It was not only the first time that the Australian Youth Squad was actively recognised, but also was the first time in its 8 year history that girls have participated in the Dallas Cup. 93 teams took part in the Dallas Cup, both boys and girls, from 14 different countries.

Our team made it to the semi-finals, but lost in a hard game to the team that ended up winning our division. All girls were proud to have done as well as we had, over-all coming 3rd out of 8 teams.

Next year it is hoped that the National Youth Squad will spend a week at the National Institute of Sport.

I don't know if you realise that we have another member of Wyoming All Age Ladies who also travelled to America in the Youth Squad. Karin Wilkinson joined our club this year. We are both hopeful of being selected again next year in the squad, and hope for the same support received this year from Wyoming Soccer Club.

I certainly hope to see the re-introduction of junior girls playing for the Club in the very near future, now that they realise there is something to strive and work for and in the end it can and will pay off, just like any other womens sport.

SECRETARY'S SCREED

Firstly we would like to wish every success to the following ladies who have been selected to play in the Central Coast Representative Reams in the State Titles at Tamworth in June.

At our Under 7 Round Robin on 28th June, 1987 we will again be holding a Cake Stall. It has become somewhat of a tradition to hold this cake stall so it would be appreciated if you could support us with this venture more details at a later date.

Congratulations to the Under 11A team for making the semi-finals of the Wakehurst Under 11 Anniversary Tournament held recently.

The Committee would like to express their congratulations to all Coaches for doing such an excellent job so far with our Wyoming teams. As you can see from the points table later in the bulletin that there is a Wyoming team near the top of the table in nearly every grade.

On 23rd September, 1986 we sent the following letter to Gosford City Council to endeavour to instigate improvements to Alan Davidson. We received a reply to this letter this week stating 'Council will be evaluating your submissions for improvements to grounds and associated facilities with the intention to list works in priority. Some of the requests received may involve application for special improvement funding and other requests may be achieved by some financial and labour in-put by the Club.'

Mr. Wally Cocksedge has decided to organise a petition to submit to our Council to try to expediate these matters, especially the Renwick Street Fence and the Fence along the top of the creek at the northern end of the park.

It would be greatly appreciated if you could help by signing this petition which will be available in the Canteen or from your Coaches/Managers.

Our letter to Council read as follows:-

' I refer you to this Club's continued endeavour to improve the facilities of Alan Davidson Park and hereunder submit a list of priorities for your consideration.

1. FENCE ALONG RENWICH STREET

With the relocation of the night lighting to the Renwick Street end of the Park, it has necessitated the training of teams close to the busy street. Players of all ages from six years to seniors need to frequently cross the street to retrieve soccer balls. Each Saturday of the competition many families of players are in attendance at matches and the danger of small children running onto the road undeterred by no fence is ever present. The Club believes it is only a matter of time before an unfortunate accident occurs.

RECOMMENDATION: A one metre high cyclone fence be erected along the full length of the Park on the Renwick Street side.

2. IMPROVEMENT TO THE NIGHT LIGHTING

Owing to the relocation of the night lighting the lack of height of the existing lights, further lighting is necessary away from the Street. This would eliminate the need for teams to train so close to the busy road and would also provide the proper balance of light over the whole park.

The Club believes that the standard of lighting at Alan Davidson Park is far below the standard provided at equivalent parks in Gosford City.

RECOMMENDATION: Additional night lighting be erected.

SECRETARY'S SCREED (Contd)

3. FENCE ALONG THE TOP OF THE CREEK AT THE NORTHERN END OF THE PARK

For many years now the decline to the northern creek has been a concern to the Club. Not only is it dangerous to players and spectators but also to anyone who visits the Park.

The Club believes that the danger of a player or spectator being severely injured whilst running to retrieve a soccer ball rolling over and down this decline is imminent.

RECOMMENDATION: A one metre fence be erected along the top of the decline at the northern end of the main playing field OR that land scaped mounds of earth be used as an interim measure.

The following projects although considered priorities are not as urgent as the above.

4. PROTECTIVE GRILL FOR ROLLER DOORS

Owing to continued vandalism the roller doors in the kiosk will soon require repairs or replacement. A deterrent to vandalism is necessary

5. TURFING OF GOAL AREAS ON MAIN FIELD

Done

6. DRAINAGE OF MAIN FIELD

After the successful drainage of the small field in 1986, the next area in urgent need of drainage is the main field. The North Eastern quarter is always a problem due to the accumulation of rain waters.

RECOMMENDATION: Installation of a suitable drainage system.

7. KICKING WALL

Soccer players require a wall at which to kick the ball to improve their skills. The walls around the kiosk and amenities take a pounding each soccer season. A special wall built at an agreed upon area in the Park would provide players with a much needed facility.

RECOMMENDATION: A solid wall the size of a goal mouth i.e. 8m x 3m be constructed.

8. DRAINAGE AROUND KIOSK AND AMENITIES

In periods of heavy rain both sides of the kiosk and amenities block become running surface drains. Many players and spectators use this area constantly and the inconvenience and ever present danger of an accident needs to be eliminated.

RECOMMENDATION: A proper drainage system be installed.

The above matters are this Club's main priorities for 1987. Your advice as to the best way to complete these projects for the 1987 Soccer season would be appreciated.

The Club is dedicated to the improvement of facilities at Alan Davidson Park and has set aside certain funds to assist with some of the projects.
