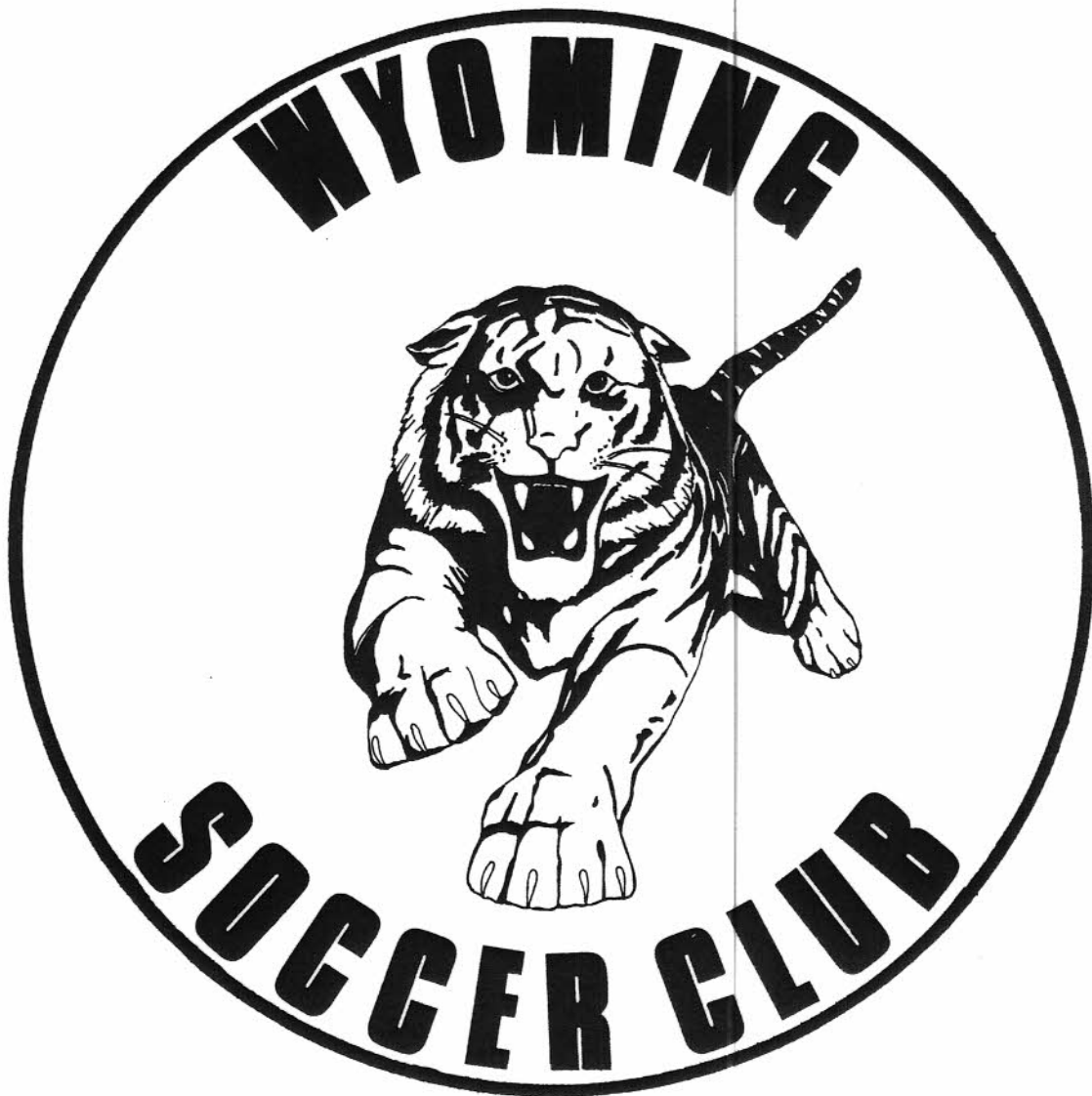

REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR 1988

Next year will see a big change in all clubs.
The CCSA is to introduce a new rule to change the birth date from 1st January to 1st August.
This is being done to bring us into line with the rest of Australia.

What this means is:-

IF YOUR BIRTHDAY IS BETWEEN 1st AUGUST AND 31st DECEMBER, YOU WILL BE ELIGIBLE TO PLAY IN THE SAME AGE GROUP IN 1988 AS YOU WERE IN 1987

The committee fully realises the problems that will arise with this change. The question every-one is asking is 'Does my boy have to stay down, or can he go up with the rest of his mates?'

Our recommendation is that we strongly urge that all players play in their correct age group next year.

This was discussed by the committee at some length. Some of us (myself included) have sons that fall into this category. We feel that it will be of advantage in the long run.

Because this is such a great change, we would like to get your ideas on the merits (or otherwise) of staying in the same age group for two seasons.

If you would like to contribute to the debate please put it in writing and post to the Secretary, or come to the next general meeting.

This was a particularly pleasing result as this Kincumber side defeated us 8 nil in the first round. 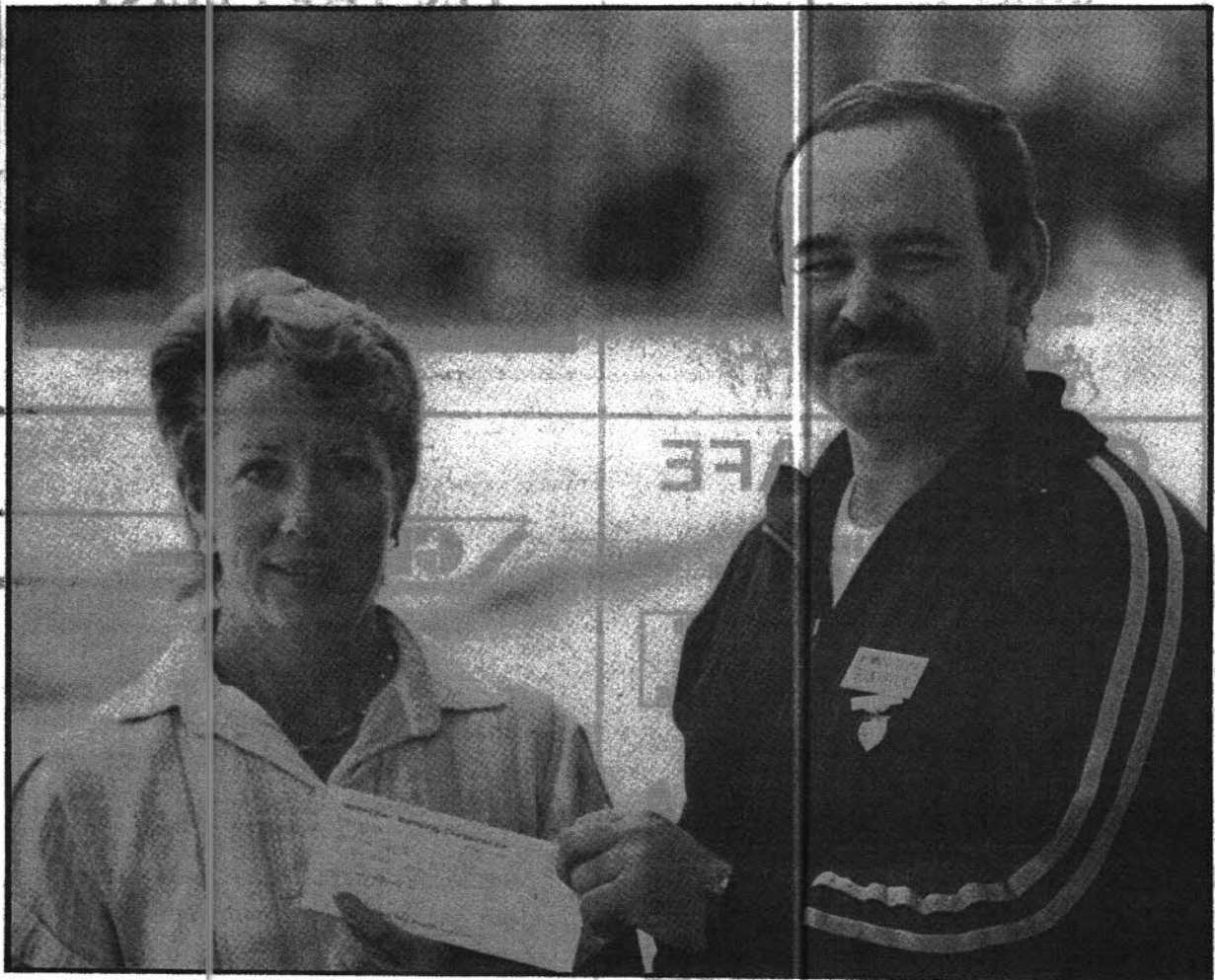


