WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

This is written mainly for new-comers to the club but I hope that everybody can get something from it.

I remember the day that I first signed my son up to play for Wyoming. When I got out of the room my head was spinning. Someone had taken money, others took photographs, somebody wanted a birth certificate, I had signed forms, got a magazine, looked at shirts....it was all jumbled up. So, here is what happens next.....

1 Firstly, please turn up for our grading days as shown further on in this magazine. This is when we put your child in a team. Under 9's upwards are selected according to soccer ability, but below that age we try to select so that friends can play together if they want to, or so transport problems can be overcome.

On these days you may also find out your coach's name, phone number, and training time.

2. It is the parents responsibility to arrange to get their children to training at the correct time, and to arrange their pick-up afterwards. Training will be at Alan Davidson Oval, and is on an afternoon that suits the coach.

3. As the start of the season gets nearer, your coach or manager will give you times and locations for matches. Again it is the parents responsibility to get their children to and from the games. We don't want our coaches to be coach drivers as well.

4. Sometime during the season your team may be asked to assist in the canteen. We will ask parents from a team to help for an hour or so. There will be a canteen supervisor there, so you won't be left high and dry. In this way we try to spread the work a bit so that the same group of people don't spend the entire soccer season in the canteen. Its also a good way to get to know other club members.

5. We will be running a number of social events during the season. Some will be family oriented, some mainly for kids, and others only for adults. Please come along and join in.... they are heaps of fun. Sometimes they are to raise money, and sometimes just to raise your spirits. There is a special social page in this and all issues of Tiger Tales, so read on.

6. Later in this issue there is an article telling you what equipment your child will need, and where to get it.

If you have any problems, talk to your coach or manager. If you feel you would prefer someone else, please contact our Public Relations Officer, Gary Johnson. He is around the clubhouse fairly often, or can be contacted on 283743.

We endeavour to be a friendly club, so don't hesitate to ask questions.

You can have as much fun or as little fun as you want.... it's up to you.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

Welcome to another soccer season. We hope everyone has an enjoyable and successful time.

If you have any queries, please do not hesitate to telephone me. It is much better to get things sorted out early than to let them go.

COACHING

The Association has advised that all coaches will **have** to hold the Level 1 Coaching Certificate. There will be courses arranged shortly, and if you are interested, could you please telephone me as soon as possible. If we have enough coaches from our club interested, we will probably be able to arrange courses at our own grounds.

This course is very basic, and helps with ideas on coaching, and to make coaching time interesting and enjoyable. You will all receive a booklet with the Level 1 Course outlines which will give you some ideas. Also in this booklet will be other information, and it would be appreciated if you could take the time to read same, and if you have any questions or queries, you will be able to get the answers at the compulsory coaches and managers meeting in March.

MEETINGS

Club General Meetings are held on the fourth Monday of each month during the season, and you are more than welcome to attend. Any new ideas or suggestions would be most welcome.

WET WEATHER & GAME CHANGES

During the season, if you are in any doubt as to whether your games or venues have changed due to wet weather, you can telephone **243782**. If there are any changes, it will be on a recorded message. Please, parents, do not let the children ring this number. It is a private house number, and sometimes there are a lot of changes on the tape, and the children just cannot understand the

message. There is only a certain amount of tape on which to fit the whole message, and it has to be said very quickly. If the children ring, they miss the message, or get the wrong one, and then you have to pay for another call, or end up at the wrong destination. It would be greatly appreciated if you could make the calls after 7.00~~pm~~ and before 9.00pm.
