Would all Coaches and Managers please note that it is imperative that you contact me as soon as possible to register **ALL** injuries. None of us can afford to be sued if something should go wrong at a later date and a claim is not registered. Parents, could you also please note that if you have reason to make a claim, the forms have to be back to me within three weeks from the date of the accident, as we have a four week time limit to register the claim in Sydney, and if this is not done, they will not accept the claim. It does not matter how small the injury may seem, it is better to send the claim and be sure.

UNDER 10 RE-DRAW

There has been a lot of people disturbed by the fact that the Under 10 competition has been changed so many times.

Unfortunately, some clubs do not seem to have done the right thing when grading their teams. Originally it seemed, there were four 'A' teams, and they could not run a competition with only four teams, so it was thought to put two of the 'A' sides in one section and two in another. Thus the big scores for the first couple of weeks. So many complaints came in that the Association put it to a meeting of all clubs that there should be a new draw put out, with 12 teams in the 'A' section. When the teams had played each other once, the first four teams would make up the first final series and the remaining four teams making up the second final series, and the remaining four teams would miss out.

I hope this clarifies the situation for you a little better. In previous years, Under 10 competition has been 'Non-competition' for the first part of the season, and then the teams divided up into the different sections. It was to try something different this season.

MEDICOS COLUMN



BLEEDING RULE

Any player bleeding from an injury or otherwise is to be immediately removed from the field of play and may not resume the field until the bleeding has been completely stemmed and properly covered. This is a F.I.F.A. ruling, and must be strictly adhered to by Clubs, their players, Coaches and Managers, and Referees (both official and unofficial).

SPORTS INJURY CLAIM

If a player is injured during a game or at training, he/she must do the following:

- 1) Report it to his manager (even if the injury does not appear at the time of the game, but later when you get home and cool down).
- 2) Contact Secretary, Marlene Bailey to obtain a claim form. - Phone 24 3782
 - (a) One form is to be completed by the player
 - (b) One form is to be completed by the doctor or hospital etc.
 - (c) These forms **MUST** be returned to the Secretary **DEFINITELY** no later than three weeks, as there is a time limit for the forms to be returned to the insurance company otherwise they will not accept them.
 - (d) It does not matter how small the injury may seem, fill in a claim form - it is too late in six weeks time when you find out that something is not right.
- 3) Certain questions must be answered on the claim form, so it is would be an idea to take notice of the following:-
 - (i) Type of injury
 - (ii) Date of injury
 - (iii) Time of Injury

R.I.C.E.MANAGEMENT

R - Rest the casualty and the injured part.

I - Ice packs wrapped in cloth may be applied to the injury - 20 minutes on and re-applied every two hours for the first 24 hours, then every four hours for a further 24 hours.

C - Compression bandage - ie elastic bandages should be applied to extend well beyond the injury.

E - Elevate the injured part.

RICE is used for bruises, sprains, coked thigh, shoulder and muscle injuries.

WINDING (Winded Player)

Cause:- a blow to the upper abdomen

Management: Lay the casualty in a comfortable position that assists breathing

DO NOT:

Do not pump legs or massage abdominal wall as this may cause further damage if the injuries are serious.

This is the first of a regular series of articles on first aid.

Moments in History

The Early History of the Wyoming Soccer Club

In 1989, Club Historian, Alistair Kennedy, put together a series of articles in the Tiger Tales detailing the history of the club. In 1990, our 20th Anniversary year, this was expanded into an excellent book, and forms a good run-down of the recent history of the Wyoming Soccer Club. There may be some copies still available.

Why did I say "recent" history?

I am now going to reveal some little-known facts about the **EARLY** history of the club. These facts have been hidden in the mists of time. In fact this article will be news to most of the present Committee, and even the oldest Club members.

The information has recently come to light following the discovery of a 'time capsule' consisting of a steel box full of old documents. This had been buried at Alan Davidson Oval, and only found when recent flood waters eroded parts of the car park.

It now seems that our club is the **OLDEST** soccer club in Australia! It was, in fact, founded in 1890. In those days the Central Coast was a pretty wild and remote place. The locals were isolated from the rest of 'civilisation', and were mainly dairy farmers, orchardists, timber getters, and the usual assortment of drifters and itinerants.

The inspiration for the club is credited to Bill 'Bluegum' Davidson. Apparently, one day while a bit bored, Bill came across the dried carcass of a kangaroo, and gave it a kick. Much to his surprise it rolled along the ground (being dried, it was fairly light). One thing led to another, and Bill eventually perfected the technique of rolling a kangaroo skin into a rough ball shape and sewing it together with rawhide. He had so much fun that he soon got some of the other locals involved, and a soccer club was born. Only about six people, but considering the scant population in those days, that wasn't too bad.

They settled on a name for their group - The Wyoming Skins Club. The name remained for a couple of years until the understandable scarcity of kangaroos forced the club to make a change. Such names as "Wyoming Cowhide Club" were considered, but the timely arrival of a new settler from England changed their ideas. He had in his possession a proper soccer ball, and the locals were forced to concede that their idea was not as original as they had first thought.

Games in those days must have been fascinating. They played on a flattish area that is now Alan Davidson Park. Goal posts consisted of a couple of tall gum trees at one end, and two heavily laden orange trees at the other. The land was not exactly cleared, and ball skills in those early days consisted of heading, very high kicks (to clear the undergrowth), and the art of tree deflections. A one-

two involving one player and a eucalyptus were quite common.

Other clubs soon formed, and a competition of sorts got under way. Games with Point Frederick and West Gosford clubs (since disbanded) weren't too bad, but a match with the Brickwharf Bruisers or the Patonga Mullets had to be carefully arranged. The 'away' team had to plan on an absence of about three or four days - one for the match and the rest for travelling. Indeed, one memorable match against the Tascott Terriers lasted for three weeks when flood waters cut the only crossing of Narara Creek.

The team was a fairly loose-knit group, with a core of about eight to ten permanent players, and the remainder made up from whoever was passing through at the time. Swagmen, gold miners heading north, escaped convicts, aboriginal hunters - everyone was welcome - a policy that continues in the club to this day.

By the early 1900's, the local competition had become more organised. Wyoming's ground had been cleared, although tree stumps still caused some problems. A bark hut club-house had been erected, the foundations of which are believed to be somewhere under the concrete floor of the new extensions. If only we had known at the end of last season!

Most important of all, the Club's colours had been selected. The gold was taken from the colour of the oranges on the trees that grew on the sidelines. The Wyoming Soccer Club tradition of oranges at half time dates back to these early days when they could be plucked from the southern goal posts.

The black was selected after a rather unusual match in March 1900 when the teams had to stop play in order to put out a raging bushfire that raced across Wyoming. When the team returned for the second half four hours later they were covered in soot, and the issue of the second colour was immediately settled.

Well, that is a very brief summary of an amazing story. There are many more interesting incidents and characters from those early days. As we go through the documents we may be able to run more articles about this fascinating time.

The long-running dispute about whether a cow can be in an off-side position.

The great trek to play Parramatta in 1895

The events leading to the folding of the club in 1914

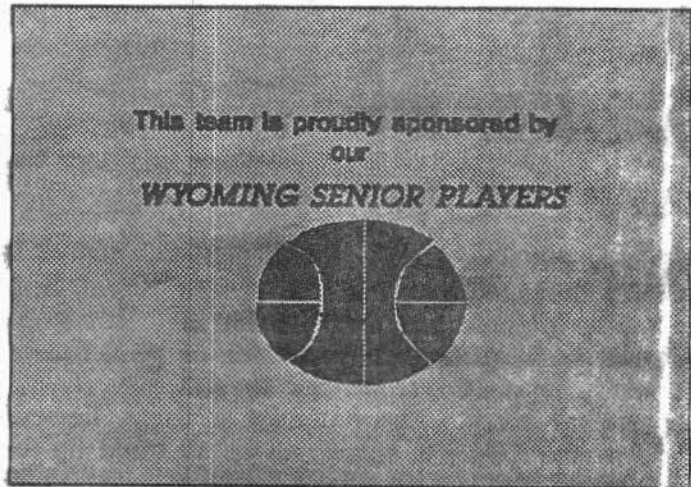

PAT RYAN

One of Wyoming's most popular coaches, Pat Ryan first coached back in 1975 when he took that season's U/6A1 team to the competition final. Always willing to help out a team in trouble, over the next seventeen years, Pat coached a further 11 teams, in the process becoming one of only five club coaches with over 200 matches to their credit.

After taking the under 19's in 1984, he moved to the senior ranks as Reserve Grade coach between 1985 and 1987, before going back to the juniors with the 1988 Under 12B1 team.

1989 was Pat's best season. He coached one junior (Under 13B2) and one senior side (third grade), taking both teams from the minor semi-finals through to their respective grand finals, surviving penalty shootouts on the way with both teams.

A committeeman in the mid 1970s, Pat was a regular attendant at general meetings throughout his years with the club, and has always been willing to help out whenever required. His contributions to the club were recognised in 1989 when he was awarded life membership.
