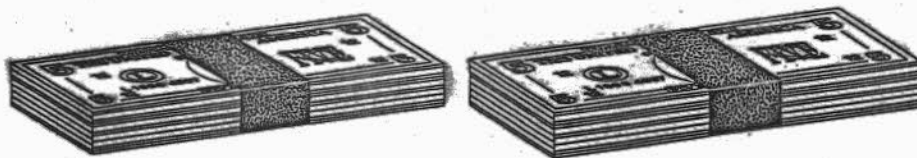

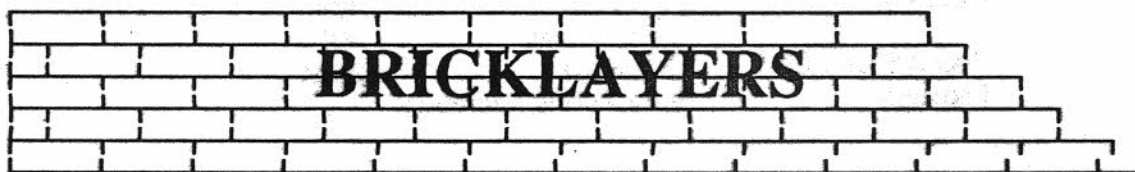

# MEDICOS COLUMN



## ANKLE SPRAINS

Ankle sprains result in rupture of the fibres of the ligaments on either side of the joint. There is always a possibility of fracture of the bones that form the ankle, however you will usually not be able to identify this.

### Symptoms and Signs

- \* Pain, which may be quite intense, and will cause restriction of movement and loss of function
- \* Tenderness
- \* Swelling
- \* Bruising

### Management

- \* R.I.C.E.
- \* Manage as for fractured ankle
- \* Seek medical aid

## MUSCLE INJURIES

### Management

- To prevent swelling and promote recovery:
- \* R.I.C.E.

## CORKED THIGH

This injury is caused by a blow to the front or outer thigh muscles. It results in bleeding into the muscles. The injured area becomes tight and painful as the muscles contract.

### Management

- \* R.I.C.E.
- \* Stretch the muscle
- \* Seek medical aid

## MUSCLE CRAMP

Cramps are spasms or abnormal contractions of muscles caused by:

- \* Overuse
- \* Excessive jarring
- \* A small tear
- \* Loss of body salts and fluids as a result of excessive sweating
- \* Poor blood supply to the area - eg because clothing is too tight

### Symptoms and Signs

- \* Pain
- \* Inability to use the muscle
- \* Stiffening of the muscle as it shortens and contracts

### Management

- \* Gently stretch the affected muscle fully
  - \* apply ice packs
- NOTE:- DO NOT MASSAGE

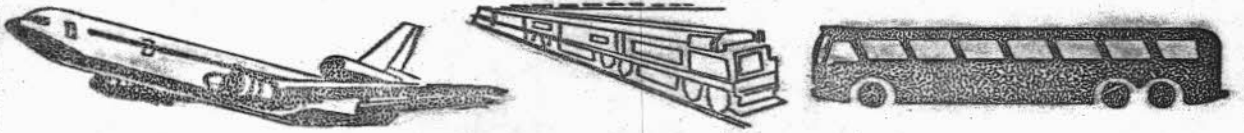

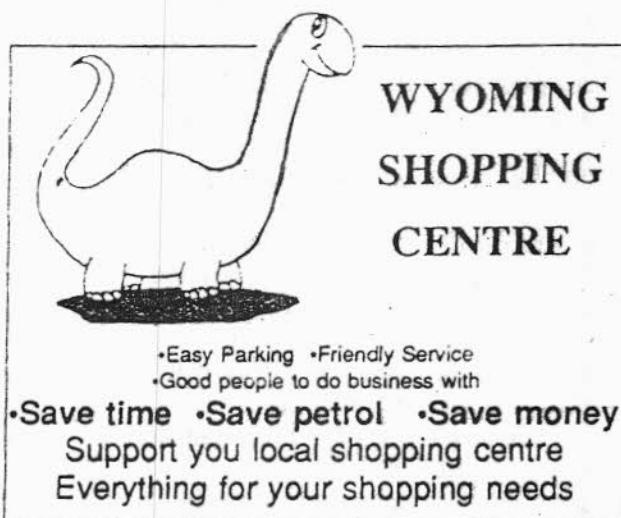

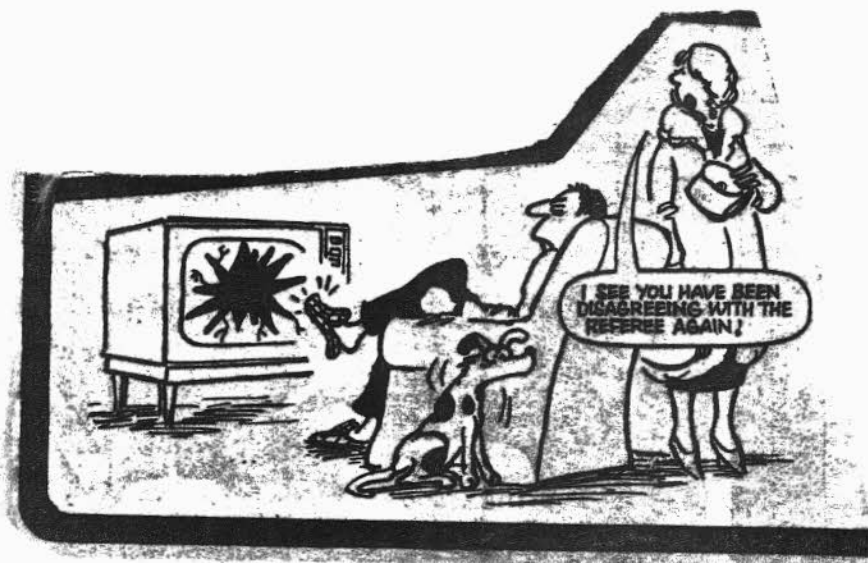
### 14/6/92 Vs Umina Lost 0-1
