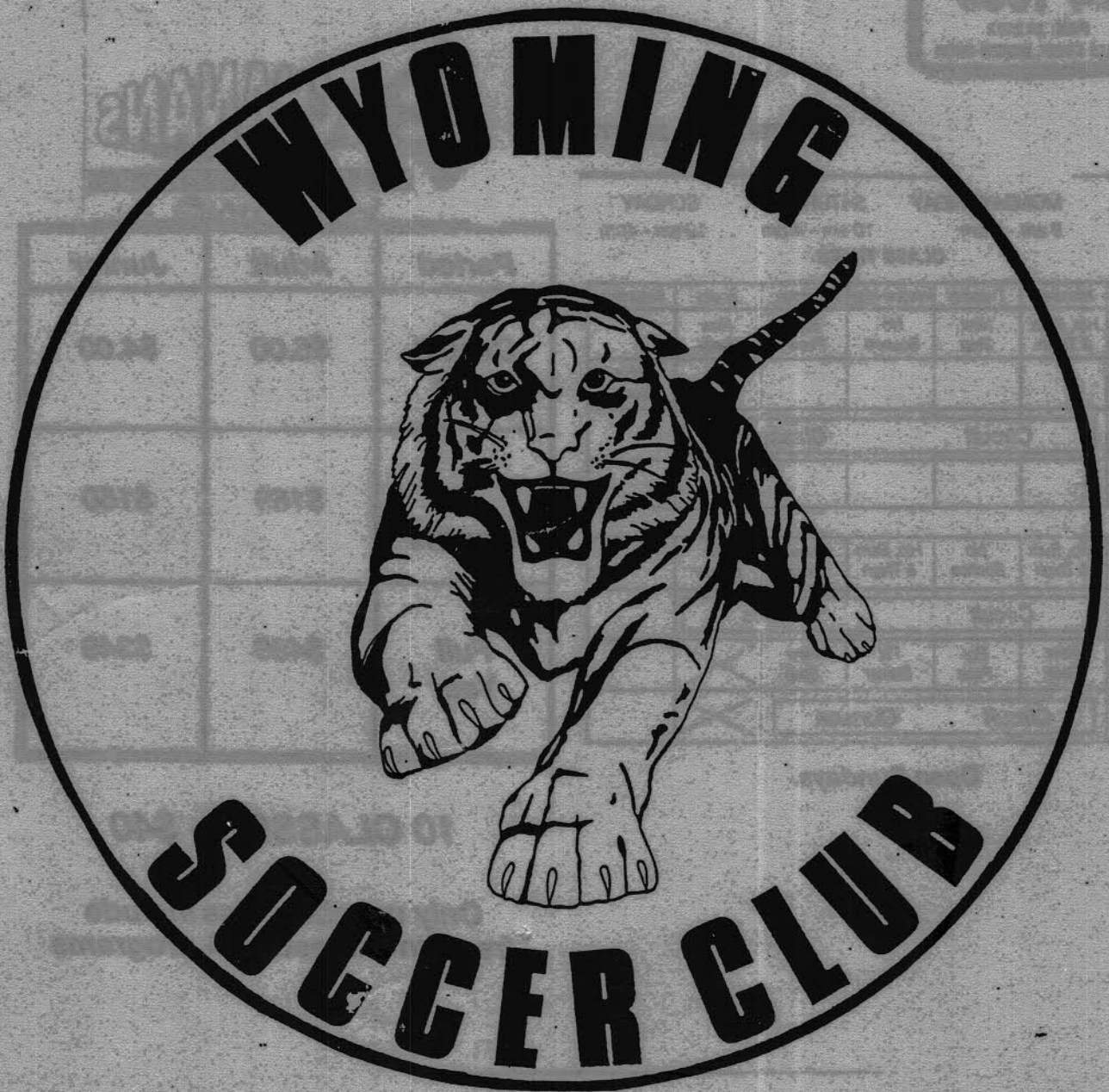

RE: PLAYER INSURANCE

ALL SENIOR PLAYERS in 1994 will have to pay the full rate for insurance, the only exemption being an all age student who must produce proof of same to claim the exemption.

Any registered player 17 or under who works full time will also have to pay the highest rate. Similarly any registered player in this younger age group who works part time may opt to pay the higher rate to cover loss of wages should he receive an injury.

It should be made clear to players, especially seniors who have commitments, that they should take out private health insurance as there is limited coverage under the N.S.W.A.S.F. Insurance scheme.

It must be made clear to players that they cannot expect to receive unlimited coverage for \$27.00/year. They must pay their accounts before submitting them to the Insurance Company who will then re-imburse them the prescribed amount due.

All claims MUST be sent through the Association Secretary. This means that the initial paper work plus any future accounts etc. are to be forwarded to the Association, who then copies everything, informs the Insurance Company that it is a bona fide registered player making the claim and sends it away for approval.
