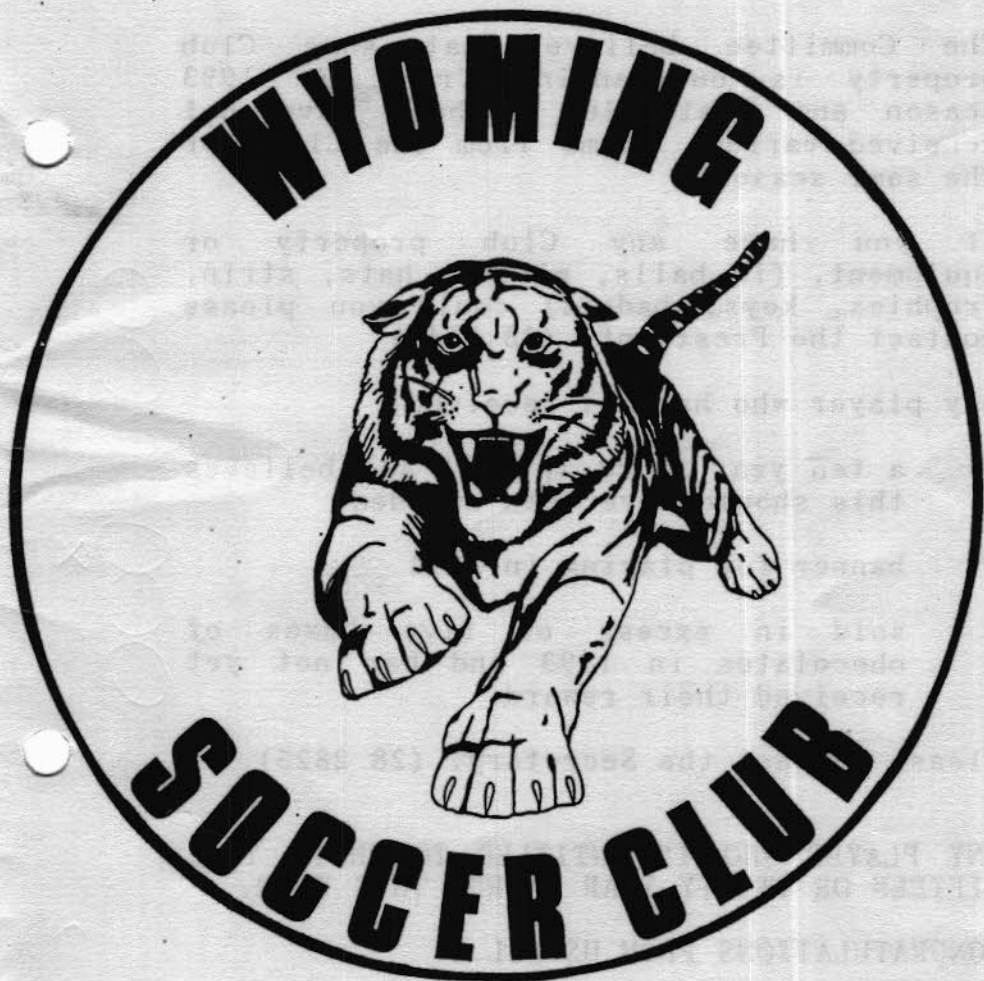

TREASURER'S REPORT

The Auditors Report for the 1993 season is still not available. The Honorary Auditor has been experiencing difficulties with the Club accounts books as presented following the AGM.

No Order Books, no signatures for stock purchased, missing invoices and generally poor management in this area have created this situation.

The 1994 Committee have addressed these matters to ensure this situation cannot develop again this year.

At this time all funds have been exhausted and the Club is in arrears to various creditors to the value of approximately \$5,000 (The exact amount is unknown as outstanding accounts could arise that have not yet been presented to the current Committee).

Hopefully with raffles, fundraising etc and joining together we can overcome these arrears and finish the season in the black.

Notwithstanding these arrears the Committee has not increased their Registrations Fees this season as we are confident the Club Members will support the Committee in their endeavours to get the Club back on an even keel by assisting and participating in all fundraising (socials, raffles, Round Robin's) that are arranged throughout the season.

At this time the Senior Fund is in the black with a current balance of \$1,476.86

The Senior Fund had no records kept apart from the deposit and cheque books so it cannot be audited. This account is used for the purchase and sale of beer, seniors match fees, senior referees fees and anything applicable to the senior players of the Club.

The Seniors meet before the commencement of the Season and sponsor a junior team from this fund for the coming year.

I, as Treasurer of Wyoming Soccer Club for 1994 season, assure you all that at each General Meeting of the Club, there will be a current financial situation presented on both accounts. Any member or parent who wishes to view the books at any other time will only need to ask and I will make them available.

EXTRACTS FROM THE CLUB BY-LAWS14. EQUIPMENT

Coaches are provided on grading day with one match ball, several practice balls, a set of playing shirts and other equipment. This equipment must be cared for during the season and returned to gear steward immediately after the last game. Shirts and balls must be held by one person at the end of each game. Under no circumstances are individual players to retain their shirts.

17. PROTEST

Should a coach or manager wish to lodge a protest after a game, the referee must be informed who will note the protest on the sheet, then the coach or manager shall sign the sheet. Only protest if you have a valid reason. Advise the Club Secretary that you have protested at the completion of your game.

21. DRESS

Players must be properly attired in the approved clubs outfit before they take the field i.e.;

- 1) Club shirt - supplied by the Club.
- 2) black shorts
yellow socks with two thin black bands at the top,
cleaned boots - all supplied by the parents.

22. BAD LANGUAGE

Club officials including coaches and managers must deter club members, players and spectators from using obscene and abusive language whilst at matches and training.

25. MONTHLY BULLETIN 'TIGER TALES'

The 'Tiger Tales' is prepared each month and a copy is given to each registered player. The bulletin contains team reports, club news and information. The Management Committee encourages you to read the bulletin to keep abreast of happenings.

28. KIOSK ROSTER

Each year the MC publishes a roster for parent assistance in the club kiosk. Managers and coaches are asked to ensure that the parents are made aware of the roster. Persons under the age of 18 are not permitted in the club kiosk because they are not covered by club insurance.

PARENT GUIDE TO PLAYERS EQUIPMENT

Ideally a player should have three types of shoes - the short rubber moulded soles for harder grounds, the long screw in type studs for softer or wet grounds, training shoes for either training, warming up or wearing to and from training and matches. Studs are used to give players the correct footing. As our grounds are usually hard most of the year, a pair of rubber moulded sole type is first preference, especially with young players who grow quickly out of shoes and who only have one pair of shoes at a time. Proper attention to shoes is essential for a player wishing to perform near his peak. Like most things, shoes will last longer and serve you better if they are cared for. Ordinary show polish is satisfactory although there are leather reconditioners on the market which are ideal for prolonging the life of your shoes. With wet shoes many make the mistake of putting them out in the sun the following day. This tends to make the leather harder and the shoes more uncomfortable to wear next time. Always wash excess mud and debris off shoes immediately and leave to dry as normally as possible without putting them in the direct rays of the sun.

New shoes should be worn in gradually before wearing them in an actual match. Many make the mistake of playing in them immediately. This can result in badly blistered feet and perhaps missing out on playing in the following match. It takes several wearings to mould shoes to your feet and this is best done over short trial periods. Dampening before use is also useful in breaking in new shoes.

LACES - These seem of minor importance but often cause the most trouble. Many a match has been lost because one of the players is out of action re-tying laces or repairing broken ones. The laces on the outside of the shoe - the area least used for kicking. Always carry a spare set of laces for emergency. Better still, check laces before going to training or matches. After laces are tied they can be covered by wrapping PVC tape around the shoe to ensure the laces do not come untied.

SOCKS - These should be light, comfortable and always kept up. Sloppy appearance lead to sloppy play. Broader elastic garters are preferable for keeping socks up to other forms of thinner tie ups. Thinner ones tend to hinder circulation and may cause circulatory problems with players' legs later in their careers.

SHINPADS - SHINPADS ARE COMPULSORY FOR ALL JUNIOR AND SENIOR PLAYERS.

SHORTS - should be comfortable and light with plenty of room for the whole range of movements. For protection purposes again, it is also advisable for players to wear one of the many types of athletic supports available.

TRACKSUITS - especially in the winter months, training and warm up for matches should be carried out in tracksuits. The idea is to keep the muscles warm and ready for action and to this end tracksuits serve a good purpose. When showers are unavailable after matches, too, tracksuits help in cooling the body down and preventing flu and other viral infections.

GOALKEEPERS - Although basically similar to the needs of other players, there are some equipment "aids" which are different from his team mates.

GLOVES for wet weather or moist grounds to improve handling. It is much harder to handle a wet and greasy ball than a dry one and gloves are a great help in this respect. Many matches are lost because the 'keeper' lets the wet ball slip through his hands - something that could be avoided if he is wearing gloves.

CAP Nearly always essential to keep the sun and glare out of the eyes. A cap is essential in this respect because a goalkeeper more than any other player is exposed to so many match deciding high balls.

All the recommendations listed above are to assist you in purchasing equipment for your boy/girl, however, it is only essential to buy shinpads, shoes, socks and shorts, all other items mentioned are recommended but not compulsory.
