GENERAL MEETINGS

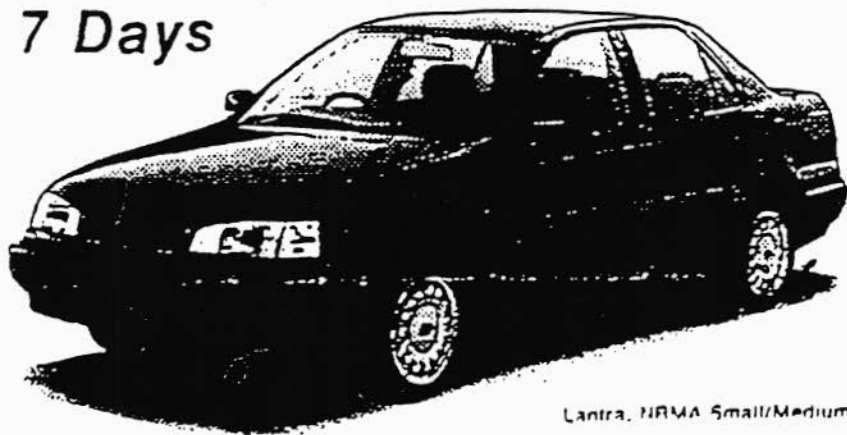

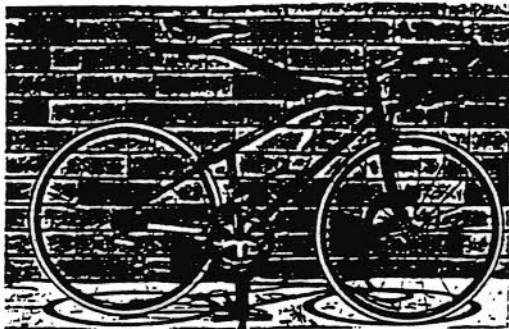

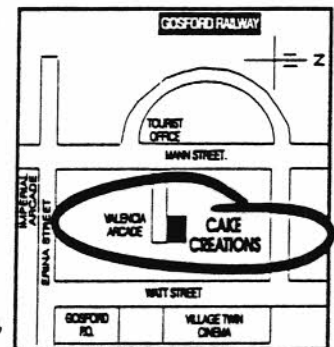

TRAINING: It is the responsibility of parents to arrange to get their children to training on time and be there to pick them up on time. Training is at Alan Davidson Oval, Renwick Street, Wyoming on an afternoon or evening that suits the Coach.

COACHES: We are a wholly voluntary organisation. All our Coaches and Managers come from with our own ranks. Most of our Coaches and Managers of junior teams come from interested parents who are willing to put in a little time to help the children. As with most of life, the more you put in, the more you get back.

Some coaches started off as somewhat hesitant parents of an U/6 or U/7 player, and have coached for many years. For some other teams, there are regular coaches who come forward after their boy is selected into a team. For other teams, particularly in the younger age groups, we will be asking for volunteers. If we get a suitable coach from within the parents of the team, fine; if not, then we will endeavour to find you a coach.

Some of our coaches will come from the ranks of our older junior players. These boys have played soccer for maybe eight years, have acquired a number of soccer skills, and are willing to put something back into both the sport and the Club.

What is particularly important is that, if your team has a young coach, that he is helped by a good manager (applies to all teams). Our younger coaches give up time to coach a team, more time to train with their own team, and also cope with high school homework etc. So although they are more than welcome to attend our meetings on the 4th Monday of every month, we expect that an adult manager would be more suitable to perform this function, and to help with the non-coaching chores that come up from time to time.

Coaches and Managers are our most important asset. We try to give as much help as possible at all times. Being a Coach or Manager can be a lot of fun, so after your team is selected and we ask for helpers **don't hold back.**

TREASURERS REPORT

1993 /1994

I have pleasure in presenting the major highlights of the 1993/1994 season.

Total expenditure for the 12 months to 30 th September was \$67707.

Total income for the corresponding period was \$65108.

This left a difference of \$2599.

The closing balance of the club as at 28th September was \$3661.13 per the bank statement.

Note included in the total expenditure was \$9213 of outstanding 92/93 accounts.

Through the efforts of all in supporting your club the financial stability of our club has once again been achieved. To date only \$2873 remain outstanding and these accounts relate to mainly presentation expenses.

We therefore approach the new season with a small but positive surplus.

Canteen

Through the outstanding and dedicated efforts of our canteen workers lead by Peter Beck sales for the year totalled \$20132. The corresponding purchases were \$13716. This left an overall profit of \$6416.

Sponsorship

The club was able to attract many new supporters as well as retain many of our old and loyal followers.

The total sponsorship amounted to \$4000 including \$400 from our seniors to an U/12 side.

Income

The major source of income to the club was from the following:

Registration Fees	\$20996
Sponsorships	\$4000
Profit from Choc Drive	\$3400

In addition income was derived from various raffles, sale of team photos, functions, gear sales etc.

Expenditure

The major outgoings were to the following:

CCSA/CCWSA -team nominations/rego fees \$13996

In addition some \$362 was paid in fines for non compliance to rules and penalties.

Hire of grounds for both competition and pre season \$2790 which was payable to either Gosford City Council or Gosford High.

Referee Fees \$2048

Nomination/ Entry Fees \$955

Purchase of stock for 94/95 season \$1634 This included match balls and clothing stock.

Senior Fund

Balance in the Senior fund was \$1479.36 as at 30 th September 1994.

Note the books have been audited and in discussions with the Licencing Board they indicate a 3-5% increase in the current liquor licence, will be applicable in the next financial year.

Finally I wish to thank all who have supported Wyoming Soccer Club in the past 12 months and look forward to a bright and prosperous 94/95 season to take the club into its 25th year of sporting achievements.

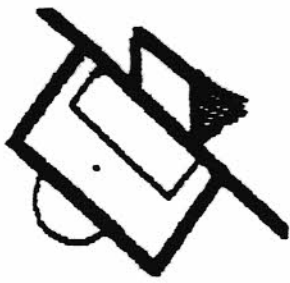

MINI & NON COMP 1995

GUIDELINES FOR COACHES, PARENTS & SUPPORTERS

The aims of mini soccer are to provide:-

- 1) Maximum participation
- 2) Maximum enjoyment
- 3) No pressure on players to perform
- 4) Results do not matter

Coaches are asked to observe the following suggestions:-

U6 & U7

- 1) Players should be encouraged to participate as much as possible.
- 2) Do not put players into specific positions - allow them to chase the ball and have as many kicks as possible.
- 3) The two coaches in each game should take a sideline each and help and encourage players of both sides.
- 4) If refereeing you should help the children as much as possible making sure they kick the ball in the right direction and encouraging them to enjoy the game. If it is necessary to stop play ensure the reason is fully explained to the offending player in a polite and not abrasive manner.
- 5) Whilst there are no corner kicks coaches should still encourage their players to clear the ball not just kick it out to get a goal kick. Such a practice could be constituted as ungentlemanly conduct and be subject to disciplinary action.

U6,U7 & U8

Whilst the offside rule does not apply it is not in the interest of the game to purposely position a player, or encourage a player to be, in an offside position. Any coach who persists in so doing will be guilty of ungentlemanly conduct and liable to disciplinary action.

U6, U7, U8 & U9

- 1) Mini and Non Comp Soccer is meant to be a nursery for our young players. Therefore any undue pressure can have an adverse effect on the players. Accordingly coaches are to make the player's supporters aware that their conduct on the sideline can have considerable effect on the players. Whilst it would be adverse to completely curb their enthusiasm any over eager supporter should be brought into line.
- 2) In the majority of instances these games are refereed either by parents, coaches or relatively inexperienced young referees. Accordingly any criticism of their performance cannot be tolerated.
- 3) In regard to the foregoing points C.C.S.A Regulations B22 and D22 provide severe penalties against offenders and their Clubs.

Laws of the game are attached for the various age groups. It is suggested that each Mini and Non Comp coach is given a copy of this sheet together with the laws for his age group.

It is also suggested that a copy of this sheet be distributed to all parents and supporters either directly or by reproduction in your Club newsletter.

UNDER 6 & 7

LAWS 1995

- 1) Size 3 Ball
- 2) Game Duration:- 15 Minutes each way.
- 3) NO coaches on field of play.
- 4) Number of Players:- 6, one of whom shall be the goalkeeper. Maximun squad 8.
- 5) Substitutes:- There is no limit to the number of substitutes.
 - Players may be substituted at any time by a player who has already played in the game.
 - Play need not be stopped to make a substitution and the referee need not be advised.
 - Substituted player must leave the field prior to the substitute coming on.
 - Substitutions must be made at halfvay line.
 - All players must have at least half a game.
- 6) NO coaching from sideline, except by the coach, and then only if information and encouragement is given in a quiet and non-hysterical manner.
- 7) Off-Side:- Off-side rule does NOT apply. However players must be in their own half at kick off. - Coaches who position or encourage players to be in an off-side position will be cited.
- 8) Free Kicks:- All free kicks will be indirect. That is to say a goal cannot be scored from a free

- kick unless the ball is played or touched by another player other than the kicker before it passes through the goal.
- All opposing players must be at least 6m from the ball.
 - Any free kicks for either side given within the penalty area shall be taken from a point on the edge of the penalty area closest to where the infringement took place.
- 9) Penalty Kicks:- There will be no penalty kicks. Any free kicks resulting from infringements within the penalty area shall be indirect free kicks and taken as described above.

 - 12) Goalkeepers:- Goalkeepers who receive the ball in the normal course of play are not bound by the four step rule and may carry the ball to the edge of the penalty area before releasing it. "Backpass" rule does not apply.
 - 13) Corner Kicks:- There will be NO corner kicks. When the ball passes over the back line play will recommence with a goal kick no matter which side put it out.
 - Coaches are not to encourage defenders just to kick ball out.

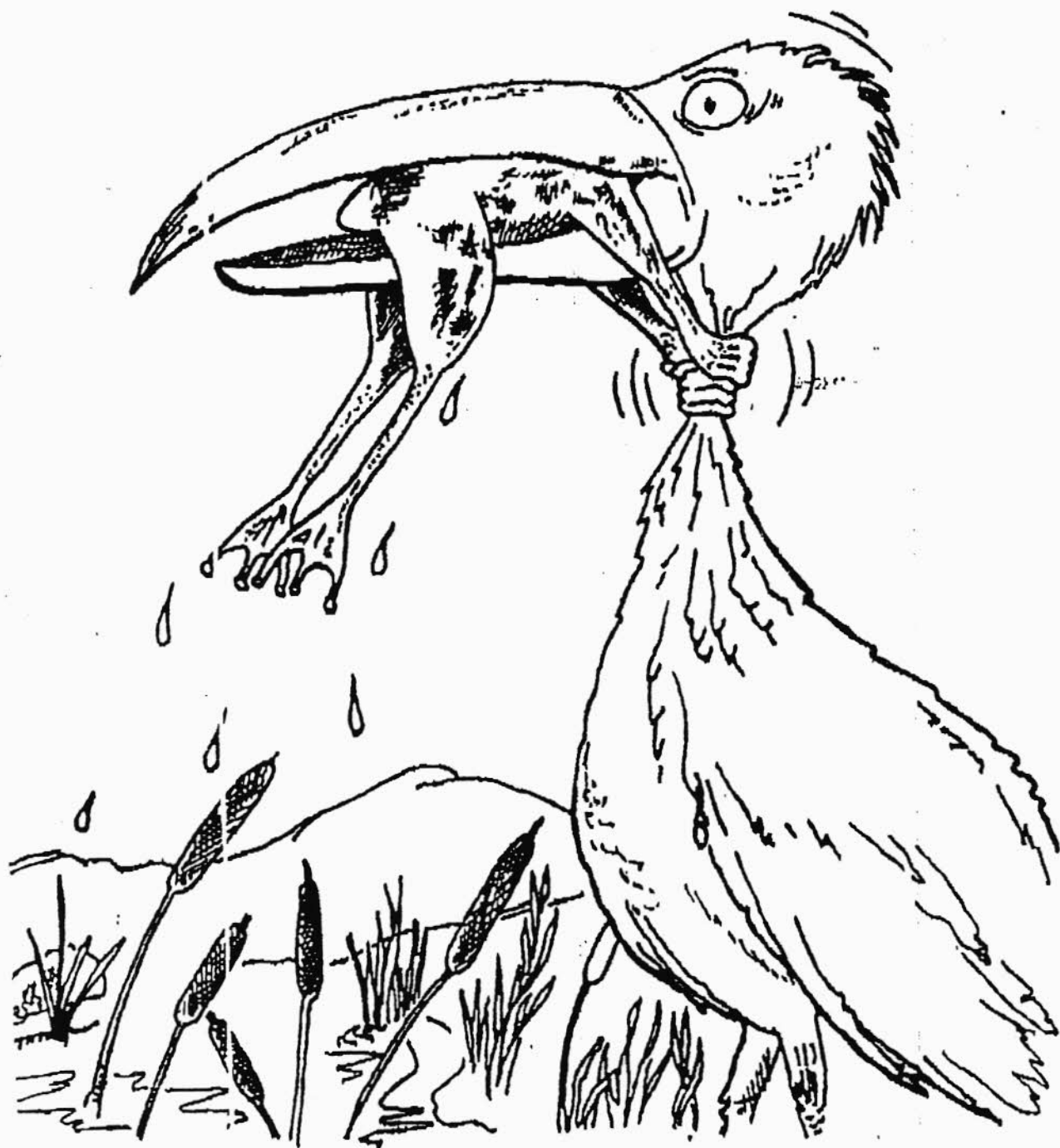

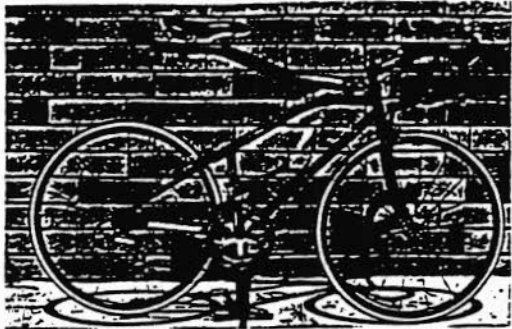

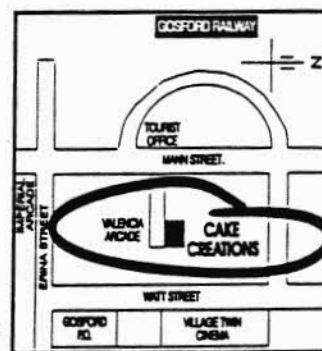

PARENT GUIDE TO PLAYERS EQUIPMENT

Ideally, a player should have three types of shoes - the short rubber moulded soles for harder grounds, the long screw in type studs for softer or wet grounds, training shoes for either training, warming up or wearing to and from training and matches. Studs are used to give players the correct footing. As our grounds are usually hard most of the year, a pair of the rubber moulded sole type is first preference, especially with young players who grow quickly out of shoes and who only have one pair of shoes at a time.

Proper attention to shoes is essential for a player wishing to perform near his peak. Like most things, shoes will last longer and serve you better if they are cared for. Ordinary shoe polish is satisfactory although there are leather reconditioners on the market which are ideal for prolonging the life of your shoes.

With wet shoes many make the mistake of putting them out in the sun the following day. This tends to make the leather harder and the shoes more uncomfortable to wear next time. Always wash excess mud and debris off shoes immediately and leave to dry as normally as possible without putting them in the direct rays of the sun.

New shoes should be worn in gradually before wearing them in an actual match. Many make the mistake of playing in them immediately. This can result in badly blistered feet and perhaps missing out on play in the following match. It takes several wearing to mould shoes to your feet and this is best done over short trial periods. Dampening before use is also useful in breaking in new shoes.

LACES: These seem of minor importance but often cause the most trouble. Many a match has been lost because one of the players is out of action re-tying or repairing broken ones. The laces on the outside of the shoe - the area least used for kicking. Always carry a spare set of laces for emergency. Better still, check laces before going to training or matches. After laces are tied they can be covered by wrapping PVC tape around the shoe to ensure the laces do not come untied.

SOCKS: These should be light, comfortable and always kept up. Sloppy appearance lead to sloppy play. Broader elastic garters are preferable for keeping socks up to other forms of thinner tie ups. Thinner ones tend to hinder circulation and may cause circulatory problems with players' legs later in their careers.

SHINPADS - SHINPADS ARE COMPULSORY FOR ALL JUNIOR AND SENIOR PLAYERS.

SHORTS: Should be comfortable and light with plenty of room for the whole range of movements. For protection purposes again, it is also advisable for players to wear one of the many types of athletic supports available.

TRACKSUITS: Especially in the winter months, training and warm up for matches should be carried out in tracksuits. The idea is to keep the muscles warm and ready for action and to this end tracksuits serve a good purpose. When showers are unavailable after matches, too, tracksuits help in cooling the body down and preventing flu and other viral infections.

GOALKEEPERS: Although basically similar to the needs of other players, there are some equipment 'aids' which are different from his team mates.

Gloves: For wet weather or moist grounds to improve handling. It is much harder to handle a wet and greasy ball than a dry one and gloves are a great help in this respect. Many matches are lost because the 'keeper' lets the wet ball slip through his hands - something that could be avoided if he is wearing gloves.

Cap: Nearly always essential to keep the sun and glare out of the eyes. A cap is essential in this respect because a goalkeeper more than any other player is exposed to so many match deciding high balls.

All the recommendations listed above are to assist you in purchasing equipment for your boy/girl, however, it is only essential to buy shinpads, shoes, socks and shorts, all other items mentioned are recommended but not compulsory.

Mandatory Instructions to referees and linesmen

The 1994 World Cup has just come to an end. From the point of view of football, it was a resounding success in which the directives issued to referees and linesmen before this competition played a major part.

These directives concerned the existing Laws, which, in the interests of the game, had to be implemented stringently.

We are now reiterating them for the benefit of your national and international referees and linesmen. They are to be regarded as mandatory instructions, which must be implemented from now on by each national association. You are therefore requested to pass on the contents of this circular to the bodies and officials concerned. (The points mentioned hereafter are included either partially or in full under the title 'Additional instructions regarding the Laws of the Game' on page 33 ff. of the 1994 edition of the FIFA Laws of the Game).

1. Tackling

- (a) A lateral sliding tackle with one or both legs is permissible if, in the opinion of the referee, it is not dangerous. If, however, the player making the tackle, instead of making contact with the ball, trips his opponent, the referee shall award a direct free kick to the opposing team and shall caution the offending player.
- (b) A tackle from behind which is violent with little or no attempt to play the ball is prohibited and shall be punished by a direct free kick and an ordering off.

2. Injured player

Team officials may only enter the pitch if the referee has given them express permission to verify injury (and not to treat it) and then to have the player carried off. A player who needs treatment must therefore be taken off the pitch for appropriate attention.

3. Player in offside position

- (a) Being offside is not an offence as such.
- (b) A player shall be penalised for being offside, if, at the moment the ball touches, or is played by, one of his team, he is, in the opinion of the referee involved in the active play by
1. interfering with play or with an opponent, or
 2. seeking to gain an advantage by being in that position.
- (c) A player shall not be declared offside by the referee:
1. if he is simply in an offside position
 2. if he takes the ball directly from a goal kick, a corner kick or a throw-in.

A linesman must not signal offside simply because a player happens to be offside.

Furthermore, if a linesman is in any doubt as to whether a player is offside (active position) or not, he should decide in favour of the attacker, in other words he shall refrain from signalling offside.

4. Time-wasting

Players guilty of time-wasting shall be cautioned for uncivilly conduct.

Referees must add on to normal playing time the time considered lost through time-wasting or any other reason such as injury, an incident or substitution etc. (cf. Law VII (a)).

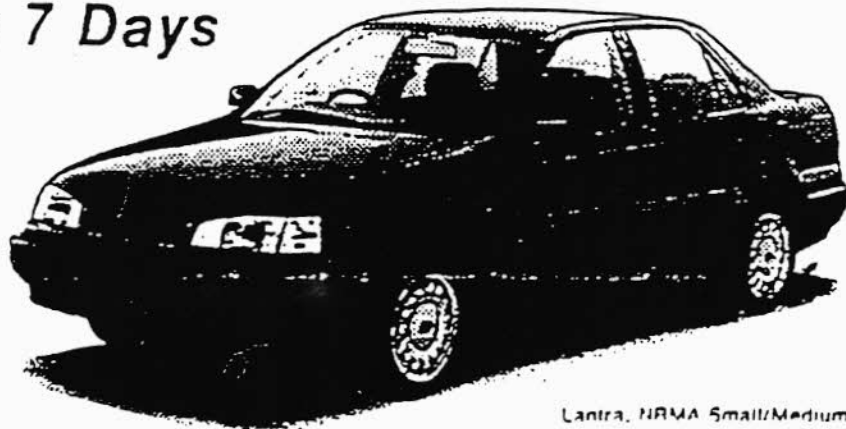
