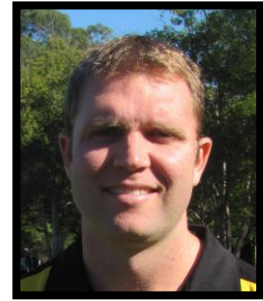


Historical Summary

Perfect lob gives Tigers the title

GOAL SEALS EPIC COMEBACK

A MOMENT of brilliance from striker Michael Payne with extra time looming was the difference as Wyoming scored their fourth Premier League title in nine years on Saturday night.

Payne, about to be replaced with cramp, was swamped by his Tigers teammates after his perfectly placed lob from outside the box proved the difference in the 2-1 win over Killarney Districts at Plum Park, Lisarow.

It was one of the most memorable Premier League grand final goals and a fitting way to end the season for the Tigers.

"The next time the ball went out I was going to take him off because he was cramping up pretty badly," Wyoming coach Steve Frame said. "It was a brilliant goal and the perfect way to win it."

Wyoming went into the match firm favourites, but were losing 1-0 at half-time after Killarney's Jared Reed sent a curving shot past Wyoming keeper Tom Coventry. The goal came within a minute of Wyoming striker Marc Falzon missing from close range.

"The first half we were terrible, it was just about the worst we've played all season," said Frame, who was celebrating his first Premier League title as a coach.

"The good thing is that we were calm in the sheds at half-time, there was no panic. In the second half we played more like we can."

Scores were level eight minutes into the second half when Nathan Moseley headed home from close range following a goalmouth scramble after a pinpoint Daniel Surridge corner. Both teams then had chances to go in front before Payne's moment to remember sealed the win.

Victory ensured Wyoming captain Marcus Steele retired in fitting fashion.

"There was way too much long ball in the first half," Steele said.

"We came back well, it's a great way to go out."

The inaugural Andrew French Medal as player of the match went to Wyoming midfielder Darren Cooper.

Tough end to great season Wyoming scores a hat-trick

THEY were gutted to lose after coming so close to a first Premier League title in nine years, but there was still plenty to celebrate for Killarney Districts this season. The heart-breaking 2-1 defeat capped what has

been a fine season for the northerners in only their second season back in the Premier League.

For long periods on Saturday night they looked as though they could have won, especially after Jared Reed gave them a first half lead with a great strike.

"To come so close and then not win is hard to take but all the boys should be very pleased with what we've achieved this season," coach Chris Ackersley said. With several young players Killarney are sure to be an even tougher proposition in 2013.

VICTORY in the men's Premier League capped a memorable Saturday night for the Wyoming Tigers.

The club completed a hat-trick of grand final successes with victory in the reserve grade and third grade deciders at Plum Park.

The Michael Kennedy-

coached Tigers continued their domination of reserve grade with a 1-0 win over Berkeley Vale. Midfielder Mark Bellemore scored the game's only goal.

It was Wyoming's fifth title in seven seasons.

In third grade Wyoming beat league champions Ber-

keley Vale 2-1 after extra time. Striker Benji Gosson capped a strong season by scoring both of the Tigers goals.
