Tigers pounce in thriller

PAYNE DOUBLE INSPIRES WYOMING TO TITLE DEFENCE

A MONTH ago the Wyoming Tigers had a huge fight on their hands to make the CountryNet Football semi-finals.

At Lisarow on Saturday night the Tigers completed an amazing comeback when they upset Berkeley Vale 2-1 in an epic season finale at Plum Park, Lisarow.

A double from sharpshooter Michael Payne was the difference as Wyoming continued Berkeley Vale's grand final woes with a 2-1 win in extra-time.

The win means Wyoming becomes only the third team in Central Coast Football history to win the premiership from fourth spot.

They are also the first club since the Gosford City Dragons in 1995-96 to defend the coast's top title. It was Wyoming's sixth appearance in a grand final in the past 10 years and their fifth win in that period.

Payne opened the scoring

in the 10th minute and Wyoming had chances to double the lead before the break. The Wombats showed fighting qualities to work their way back. Defender Simon Vella equalised after 74 minutes and neither team could capitalise on chances before full-time. It took Payne only two minutes of extra-time to score the winner. His double made him a standout winner of the Andrew French Medal as man of the match. After going seven games winless, the grand final win was Wyoming's fifth victory on the trot.

"A win over Umina was the turning point, we changed the formation and saved our season," Wyoming coach Steve Frame said. "For the past five weeks we've played all the top teams and beaten them all; every game has been sudden-death."

Payne's 16 goals made him top scorer in the league. He scored five more in the finals.
