### THE BYE WEEKEND

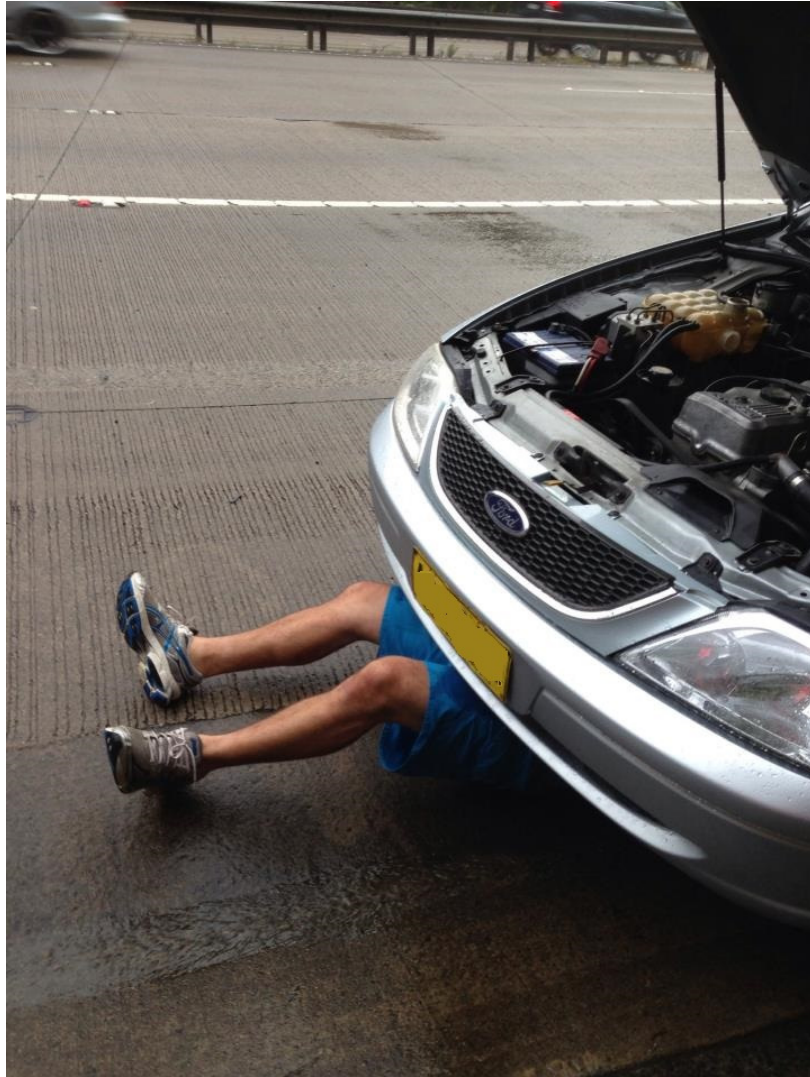

## THE BATTLE FOR THE TOP FOUR



### **WYOMING**

Ultimately, Wyoming have the final say in who wins the League Champions crown. Two wins and it's all theirs, they will sit pretty on 36pts. A win and a draw will more than likely give them the prize as well because whilst EG2 could join them on 34pts (if they win both remaining games), they would still need to reduce a differential deficit of at least 12 goals to match them.

If EG2 loses or draws one of their games, then Wyoming only need to win one game but not concede too many goals in fear of Umina catching them on for and against.



### **EAST GOSFORD 1**

East Gosford 1 have played their full 16 games and have a bye this weekend. They finish the season on 30pts. They are currently placed 2nd but unless Umina and East Gosford 2 experience upsets, they'll most likely finish 4th.



### **UMINA**

Umina picked up only 4 points of a possible 9 during the past four days to give Wyoming the upper hand for the minor premiership. With only one game remaining - an expected win over Terrigal this weekend - Umina should finish the season on 33pts.



## **EAST GOSFORD 2**

East Gosford 2 currently sit in 4th but have a double header this weekend. Wins over Woy Woy and Southern Ettalong could see them finish on 34pts. They did lose to Woy Woy in their previous encounter so this is a definite danger game for them.



## **WOY WOY**

Woy Woy have the faintest of hopes. They need to defeat East Gosford 2 and Wyoming over the weekend and hope Southern Ettalong pulls off a major coup against East Gosford 2 on the Sunday. If they do secure these six points, they will still need to gain a differential advantage over EG2 (currently five goals above them) to push them out of the Semi Finals ... EG2 and Southern Ettalong play the earlier game on Sunday morning so Woy Woy will know if they're still a chance for finals football before kick off against Wyoming that afternoon.



## **KARIONG**

Kariong's loss to EG1 last Saturday has seen them drop out of the finals race. They are currently 8pts clear of the Top 4 and play their final game of the season against Wyoming on Saturday.



### **THE BATTLE FOR THE SPOON**

The battle for the wooden spoon takes place on Saturday with Avoca and Southern Ettalong fighting it out. SE sit 3pts behind Avoca but will need to score several more goals than their opposition, particularly if they lose against EG2 the next day.
