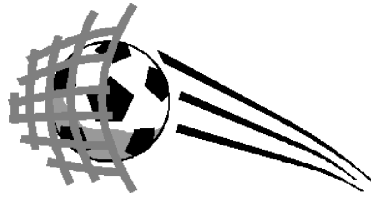
WOMEN'S ALL-AGES 5
