**A GREGG-ARIOUS ASSIST**

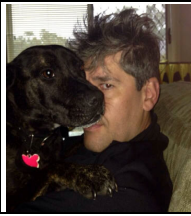

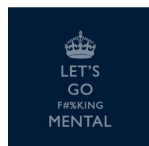
