And so, in the last round of the season, 2013's 35ES premiers (Wyoming) finally met 2014's 35ES premiers (Avoca). What was touted pre-season as the possible championship decider was by now a dead rubber. Wyoming had clinched the League Championship two rounds prior whilst Avoca hadn't lived up to the promise of the past two seasons (they also took out the 35FS premiership in 2013) by not qualifying for finals football this time round. Nevertheless it was the Sharks who took an early lead prompting Tigers fans to be concerned that after last week's drubbing, a slump was developing. But even without two of their best roaming midfielders on the park today, the Tigers fought back taking the lead before half time and capping it off with a third goal in the second half. 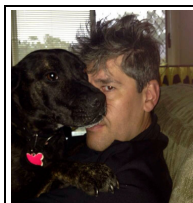

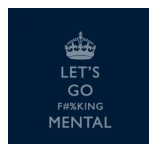
