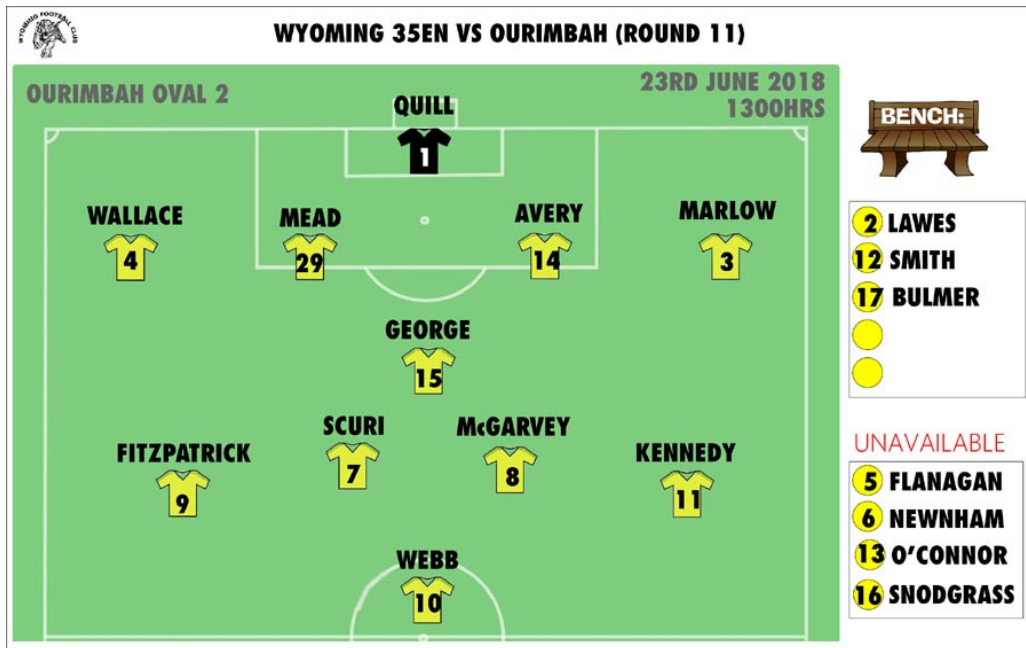

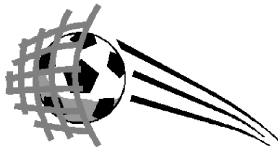

WEEK 11 WRAP-UP

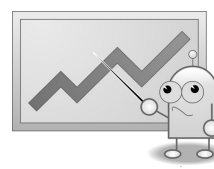
